The BOLDIC Award was created as a part of the original BOLDIC project ending in 2005, in which the award was supposed to be a tool for showcasing best practices and successful experiences in adult education.

It aims to honor people and organizations excelling in the ODL field (Open and Distance Learning) and e-learning.

What can be awarded?

Any ODL-activity connected to adult learning meeting one or more of the following criteria

- Teaching/learning arrangements
- Support systems (for delivery of learning content or/and learning support)
- Development of activities, content or understanding within the ODL area.

The activities should

- Be transferable to the whole BOLDIC region
- Be learner focused
- Facilitate blended or flexible learning
- Be innovative
- Be scalable
- Have a sustainable strategy
- Have a sensible and appropriate approach to technology
- Involve continuing evaluation

Both persons and organizations can be nominated

The nominees have to base their work in one of the BOLDIC partnership countries (or within the Nordic/Baltic area), but are free regarding partners based in other countries.
